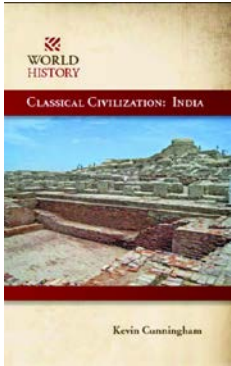

Classical Civilization: India.

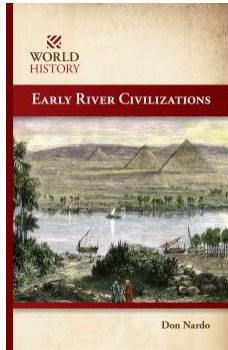
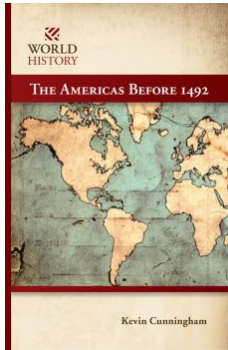

Archaeologists suggest that around 3300 BCE, the ancient Indus Valley civilization existed in what is today India and Pakistan. The people, more generally called Harappan, had by 1700 BCE nearly died out or were dispersed. Unlike successful excavations and archaeological finds of ancient Greece and Rome, only one major excavation and a smattering of artifacts have been found to substantiate the Harappan civilization. Therefore, to describe these people, Cunningham chooses words carefully, as so much must still be left to conjecture. Yet he manages to paint a detailed picture and successfully relate the Harappan culture and trade to modern-day life in India. The writings of

invading peoples, even in later centuries, help further piece together the story. The book's parchment-style background design is nicely broken up with art, artifacts, maps, and modern photographs of ruins. Another strong entry into the World History series.

Gr 9 Up—Solid historical accounts are threaded together by the theme of societal clashes, as one group sought—often violently—to dominate another. The pages resemble aged parchment, and the text mingles with distinguished photography and artwork and dark-red sidebar boxes, lending a stately seriousness that mirrors the somber intensity of these pivotal events in history. 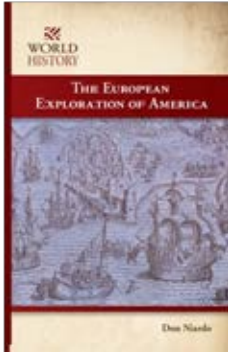
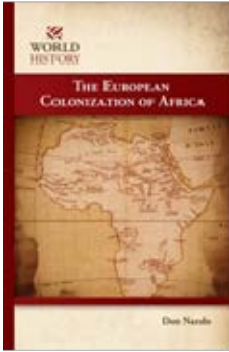
**Tristate Book of Note
